

Vladimir Verkholyak

Was born on April 3, 1957 in the city of Kryvoi Rog (Ukraine). In 1980 graduated from the oriental faculty of the Leningrad State University with a degree in “Korean philology”. During his studies, Vladimir did one year internship at the University of Kim Il Sung (DPRK) under the guidance of Professor Kim Yeong Hwang, where he also read ancient Korean texts. In 1984 was admitted to the graduate school of the Leningrad State University, from which he graduated in 1988.

Vladimir holds PhD in Philology (1989), dissertation topic: [“Grammatical categories of predicative in Korean language of 17th century \(based on the material of “Park Thongsa Ŏnhae”\)”](#). Professor.

Lecturer of the Oriental Faculty of the Far Eastern State University (1980–1990), the Department of Korean Philology at the Oriental Institute of the Far Eastern State University (1991–1994), Head of the Department of History, Economics and Culture of Korea at the Higher College of Korean Studies of the Far Eastern State University (1995–2000). Director (1994-2003), scientific director (since 2003) of the Higher College of Korean Studies, Far Eastern State University, Director of the Regional Center for Russian-Korean Cooperation (2005-2010).

The main courses taught: “Korean language”, “History of the Korean language”, “Korean dialectology”, “Areal connections of the Korean language”, “The Altai problem and the origin of the Korean language”. Participant of many regional and international Korean studies conferences. More than 20 scientific papers have been published.
